8. Because of the delay, the Pilgrims (**not build**) enough houses and they (**not collect**) enough food when winter(**begin**) .
9. By spring, half of the 100 Pilgrims (**die**) of hunger and cold.
10. But then, in March 1621, the Pilgrims (**meet**) the friendly Wampanoag tribe.
11. One member of the Wampanoag, Squanto, even(**know**) some English because several years before he(**spend**) some time in Europe.
12. The Wampanoag (**show**) the Pilgrims how to hunt and fish.
13. They also(**give**) the Pilgrims seeds to grow corn and beans.
14. After the Pilgrims (**harvest**) the food in autumn, they (**celebrate**) their good harvest with the Wampanoag.

This event is known today as the first Thanksgiving.
