

# Irregular Plural Nouns Worksheet

Some singular nouns have special irregular forms.

child → children

mouse → mice

Some nouns share the same singular and plural noun forms.

moose → moose

sheep → sheep

There are no rules for these irregular nouns, so they must be memorized.
