

Second Conditional

We use the **second conditional** to talk about unreal or unlikely situations.

Would is the past tense form of *will*.

(It's the same as first conditional, but in past)

Structure: If + subject + **past simple**, + subject + **would** + verb

Subject + **would** + verb + If + subject + **past simple**

If	I was a pilot, she saw a spider, we were explorers,	I would fly to Hawaii. she'd run away. we'd discover a cave.
