Viking men would travel to far off lands to explore and raid. This was known as going "viking." Today, the word Viking refers to people from Scandinavia during the Viking age.

Viking warriors did not wear helmets although horns may have been worn in rituals before the Viking age.

FARMERS AND TRADESMEN

While Vikings were known as warriors, most Vikings were . They would only go on raids during the summer season. Vikings were also craftsmen, and traders. Viking men and women were skilled at making what they needed, including clothing, boats, jewelry and weapons. learned these skills from a young age.
