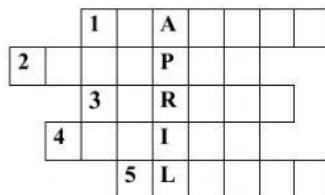

A

The Rolling Stones are an English rock band formed in London in 1962. Although they initially wanted to share their enthusiasm for rhythm and blues, they were received as symbols and leaders by young rebels. The first line-up had Brian Jones on guitar and harmonica, Ian Stewart on piano, Mick Jagger on lead vocals and harmonica, Keith Richards on guitar and backing vocals, Bill Wyman on bass and Charlie Watts on drums.

B

Jones was the founder and leader of the band, but Jagger and Richards started writing songs together and they assumed the leadership. In 1969, Jones gave up the band because he had health problems. Since Wyman left in 1993, the full band members have been Jagger, Richards Watts and guitarist Ronnie Wood, who joined in 1975, replacing Mick Taylor (who had left after Jones).

C

The Rolling Stones were in the vanguard of the 'British Invasion' of English bands that became popular in the US in the mid-1960s. When they originally became internationally famous, they were portrayed as the 'Anti-Beatles', displaying a less clean sound and seen as more rebellious than many of their contemporaries.

D

They produced fewer albums in most of the 1980s, as Jagger and Richards began to show disagreements. The band is believed to have lost its major commercial appeal during this time. Despite this, they have still continued to record together and embark on very successful worldwide tours. In total, they have released twenty-four studio albums and numerous compilations.
