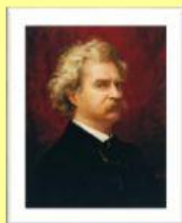

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10. Read a short paragraph about Mark Twain



a. Mark the sentences by T, F or NIT.

Samuel Langhorne Clemens was born in 1835 in a small town in Missouri. He lived together with his sister and two brothers. In his books, he often describes his childhood and his adventures in his hometown and its surroundings. His father died when he was only eleven years old, so he quit school and started working as an apprentice in a printing workshop to help support the family. At the age of 21, he started training as a steamboat pilot, his childhood dream. When the civil war started he started writing for the newspapers.

At that time, he took on the pen name Mark Twain which comes from the expression used on steamboats to signal that the water was 12 feet deep which is a little more than 3.5 m deep. Since he was a witty writer, he was quite popular, so even though he had some financial problems because of his need for adventure, he was able to pay his debts by giving lectures, teaching and writing. He got married in 1870 and had three daughters and one son. He died of a heart attack in 1910.

As a person, he was quite liberal for that time and he supported the abolition of slavery and the women's rights. Two of his most famous books are *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer* and *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*. When exploring the background of his books, we often come across places and people that really lived there at that time.
