










Adverbs of Degree	Explanation	Example
very	It means something is done to a high degree.	<i>She managed to complete the race very quickly.</i>
too	It means more than enough or excessive degree.	<i>The shoes are too small for him to wear.</i>
enough	It means a satisfactory amount or sufficient degree.	<i>The water was shallow enough for them to walk through.</i>
