

Subjects and Verbs Must Agree

You already know that nouns, pronouns, and verbs can show number; that is, they can be singular or plural.

Subjects and verbs must agree in number.

If the subject is singular, the verb must be singular.

singular singular

My cat purrs when I pet her.

singular singular

She is a Persian cat.

If the subject is plural, the verb must be plural.

plural plural

My cats purr when I pet them.

plural plural

They are Persian cats.



- Verbs ending in -s are singular. Study the singular and plural forms of the following verbs.

Singular

(he) is

(he) does

(he) was

(he) has

(he) goes

Plural

(they) are

(they) do

(they) were

(they) have

(they) go

- The contractions *isn't*, *doesn't*, *wasn't*, and *hasn't* are singular.
- The contractions *aren't*, *don't*, *weren't*, and *haven't* are plural.
- The pronoun *I* usually takes the plural form of the verb; the pronoun *you* always takes the plural form of the verb.
- Compound subjects joined by *and* take a plural verb.
