

A **simple sentence** has one complete thought.

*The boy ran to the store.*

A **compound sentence** has two complete thoughts joined with a comma and conjunction.

*The boy ran to the store, and his sister stayed home.*

A **complex sentence** has one complete thought plus a dependent clause.

*The boy ran to the store where he bought milk.*
