

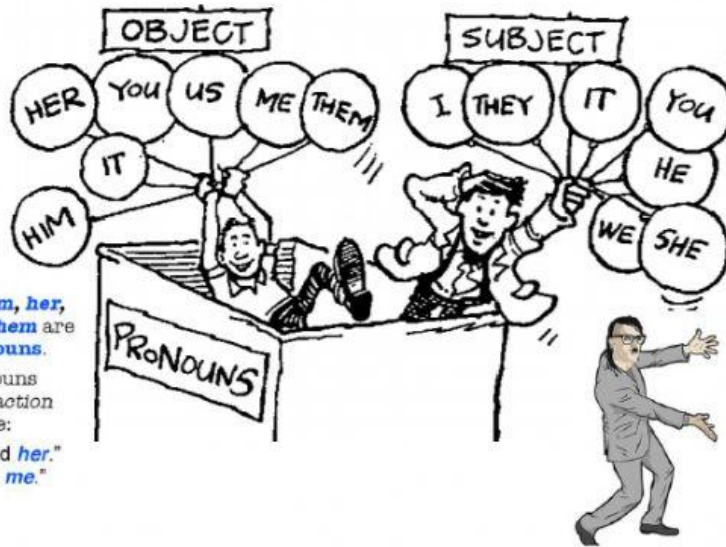
Subject and Object Pronouns



Me, you, him, her, it, us, and them are object pronouns.

Object pronouns receive the action of a sentence:

"John kissed *her*."
"She called *me*."



I, you, he, she, it, we, and they are subject pronouns.

Subject pronouns perform the action of a sentence:

"*I* wrote the book."
"*She* read it."
