

We use past tense verbs to talk about things that **already happened**.

Some verbs change to the past tense by adding **—ed** at the end.

If the verb ends in **e**, we just add a **d**.

Take a good look at these examples.

answer – answered

ask – asked

walk – walked

promise – promised
