

Subject and Predicate

A sentence has two main parts a **subject** and a **predicate**.

The **subject** tells **who** or **what** the sentence is about.

The **predicate** states the **action** or the **condition of the subject**. The predicate always contains the **verb** of the sentence.

Both can be identified as a group of words. This is called a complete subject or a complete predicate.

They can also be identified as single words, which are the core of that part of the sentence. This is called a simple subject or a simple predicate.

Example:

The southern part of our province has a warm climate.

Complete subject (group):

The southern part of our province

Complete predicate (group):

Has a warm climate

Here, the single words (simple subject and simple predicate) are identified. The sentence is about a province and the verb is **has**.

Exceptions:

Indiana Jones **has raided** many archaeological sites.

Here, the simple subject (Indiana Jones) is two words because it is a person's name. The simple predicate (**has raided**) is also two words because it is a compound verb.
