



ADVERBS COMPARISONS

REMEMBER:

>Adjectives are words used to modify or describe a noun or pronoun.

>Adverbs are words used to modify an adjective, a verb or an adverb.

A)There are 3 forms of adverbs or adjectives used to show varying degrees of comparisons:

1.- Positive form : There is no direct comparisons.

Big, happy,long, healthy,late, good.....

2.- Comparative form: We compare two things.

*My dog is bigger than your dog.

* This term is harder than last term.

*A dolphin is more intelligent than a cat.

3.- Superlative form: When more than two things are being compared with one another.

*Jenny is the tallest girl in her class.

*This book is the most interesting in my library.

B) ADVERBS COMPARISONS:

comparisons with more/the most , all the adverbs ending in -ly except early	comparative	superlative

healthily	more healthily than	the most healthily
comparisons with -er/-est all the adverbs with one syllable	comparative	superlative
hard	harder than	the hardest
high	higher than	the highest
fast	faster than	the fastest
late	later than	the latest
+ the adverb "early"		
early	earlier than	the earliest
Irregular adverbs	comparative	superlative
well	better than	best
badly	worse than	worst
much	more than	most
little	less than	least
far	farther than	farthest
far	further than	furthest
