Request / Permission (polite)

For example: May I borrow your book?

Possibility (uncertain)

For example: It may rain tomorrow.

CAN

Request (informal)

For example: Can I borrow your book?

Ability

For example: She can play piano.

MUST

Obligation or Duty

For example: We must wear a seatbelt while driving.

Prohibition

For example: You must not use phone while driving.

SHOULD

Advice

For example: You should take a break and rest.

Obligation or duty

For example: You shouldn't throw litter on the street.

NOTE: must/mustn't are stronger than should/shouldn't
