

## Possessive Pronouns

A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun. It is used to avoid repeating information that has already been made clear.

Possessive pronouns show ownership. They do not need apostrophes.

2 <sup>nd</sup> person	Yours	Yours
3 <sup>rd</sup> person	His/Hers/Its	Theirs
