








ACTION VERBS FOR LESSON LEARNT

Why do characters need to learn a lesson?

Every character undergoes a change in his behaviour through solving a problem. By solving a problem, or undergoing a situation, something about him much change. Your readers want to see a positive change in your character. This is why it is important to talk about a LESSON LEARNT and tie it with a PROVERB.
