



A personal pronoun used as a **subject** of a sentence is called a **subject pronoun**.

- Her vacation had to be cancelled due to COVID 19.
- He and I heard all of the details.

A personal pronoun used as a **direct object**, **indirect object**, or **object of the preposition** is called an **object pronoun**.

- The sea captain took us for a ride on the Lady Matilda. He told him and me stories.

**Subject pronouns:** *I, me, he, she, it, we, and they.*

**Object pronouns:** *me, you, him, her, it, you, and them.*

- ❖ Remember to use the correct pronoun form with a compound subject or object pronoun.
- ❖ Subject pronouns replace the nouns they represent. Do not use a subject pronoun with the noun it represents.
- **no** - Carrie **she** studied Botany
- **yes** – Carrie studied Botany
