

## Articles – A, An, and The

- Use “a” before a general singular noun that begins with a consonant.
- Use “an” before a general singular noun that begins with a vowel.
- Use “the” before specific singular or plural nouns.

### Examples:

I ate **a** banana and **an** apple. We went on **a** boat and then **an** airplane.

Maria picked **an** apple. She put **the** apple in her basket.

All of **the** apples were delicious!
