Conditional Sentence Type 1 ➔ Used to talk about possibilities in the present or very probable situation in the future if a condition is met.

Form: If + Present Simple, + Future Simple

<b>If + Present Simple, + Future Simple</b> (Subj. + V.1)      (Subj. + will V.inf)	<b>Future Simple if Present Simple</b> (Subj. + will V.inf)      (Subj. + V.1)
If you study hard, you will pass my exam.	You will pass my exam if you study hard.
<b>If-clause</b>	<b>Result clause or Main clause</b>
<b>If</b> you study hard,	you will pass my exam.
