The train leaves at 10 pm.

The exam is on Thursay next week.

Use the present simple to talk about these future events

1. Jack's party begin / begins at 2 pm on Saturday afternoon
2. The school bus leaving / leaves in three minutes. Run!
3. Our school holidays don't start / doesn't start in June next year. They start in August.
4. Dinner at Grandma's isn't / be at 9 pm tomorrow. It's at 8 pm tonight. Don't be late!
5. Today we have / had art at 10.30. Don't forget to get your pencil case!
6. The documentary finish / finishes at 7 pm tonight.
7. The plane lands / land in New York at quarter to nine tonight.
8. What time does / is the history exam start tomorrow?
9. I think tonight's film starts / start at 9.30 on channel 4.
10. What time does / did the train to Oxford leave tomorrow?
