Simple Past Affirmative and Interrogative

We use the Simple Past to talk about things we did in the past. We use the simple past form of the verbs.

There are two types of verbs: regular and irregular.

Regular verbs: add **-ed** to the verb. Ex. walk- **walked**.

Irregular verbs have different endings. Ex. go- went.

To make questions in simple past, we use the help of **DID** and the verb **doesn't change**.

We use the simple past form of the verbs **ONLY** in affirmative sentences.

Ex. **Did** you **go** to school?

Yes, I did. (short answer) I **went** to school. (Affirmative)

No, I didn't. (short answer) I **stayed** at home. (Affirmative)
