

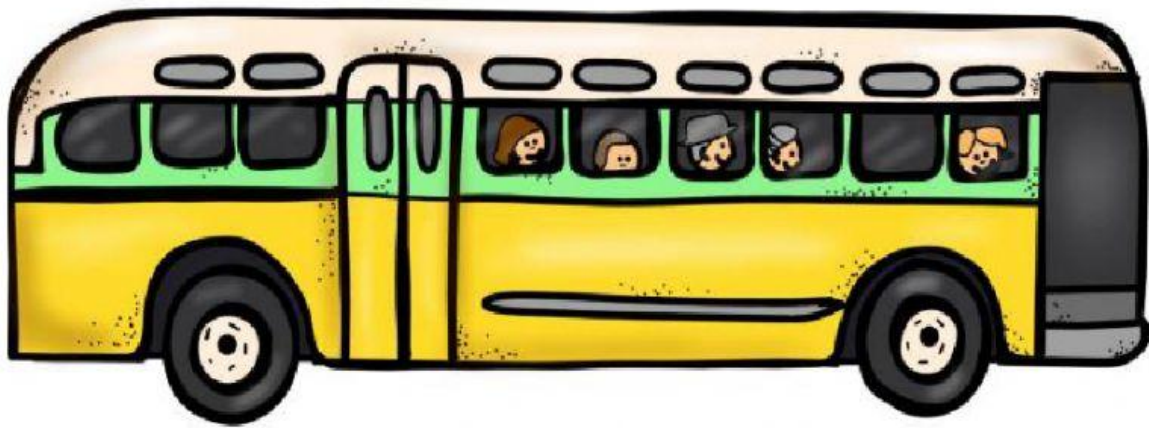
Rosa Parks Rides a Bus
