- We use as + adjective + as to compare two things that are equal.

Kevin is as tall as his father now.

- We use not as + adjective + as to compare two things that are not equal.

Running isn't as dangerous as climbing.

- We can also compare two people or things that are not equal by using:

- Adjective + -er + than ...or... more + adjective + than

My computer is newer than yours.

Elena's cellphone is more expensive than Carlos'.

- To compare three or more things, we use superlatives.

- The + adjective + -est ...or... the most + adjective

Today was the worst day of my life.

This is the most peaceful place I've ever been.
