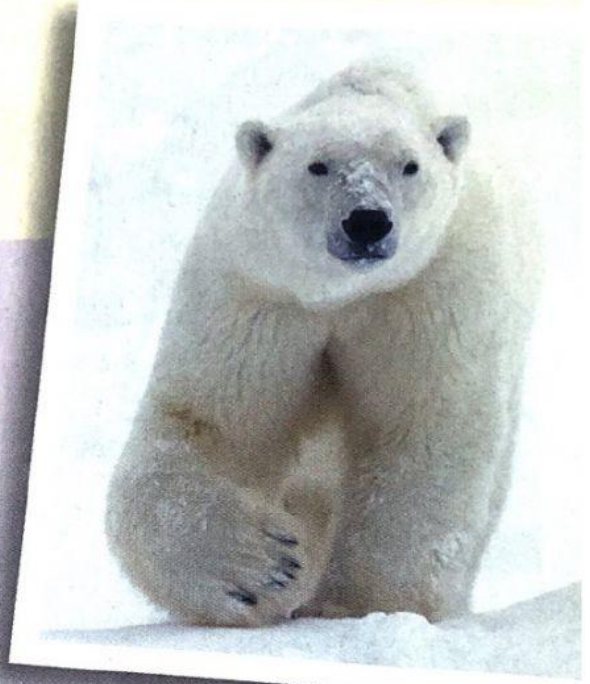
An amazing animal: the polar bear

The polar bear is the largest bear in the world. Some males can be three metres tall and can weigh as much as 700 kilos.

They live mostly in the Arctic, where the temperature can go down to -45 degrees.

Polar bears keep warm because they have thick fur, small ears and short tails. They eat seals and fish. They find food easily because they can smell a seal under the ice from many kilometres away. Unfortunately, there aren't many polar bears left – only about 22,000 in the world.

Interesting fact: Polar bear fur isn't white. It doesn't have any colour! The white colour comes from snow and light.
