

## NEGATIVE INVERTED CONDITIONALS – CONTROLLED PRACTICE

Notice that with inverted negative conditionals, we can't use contractions:

If she doesn't phone soon, we'll have to leave

*Should she not phone soon, we'll have to leave.*

NOT ~~Shouldn't she phone, ...~~

If he wasn't a diplomat, he wouldn't have immunity.

*Were he not a diplomat, he wouldn't have immunity.*

NOT ~~Weren't he a diplomat, ...~~

If he hadn't told me himself, I'd never have believed him.

*Had he not told me himself, I'd never have believed him.*

NOT ~~Hadn't he told me himself, ...~~

2. If I hadn't argued with my father, he would've lent me his motorbike.  
\_\_\_\_\_, he would've lent me his motorbike.
3. If Dick doesn't help his friends, they will be angry with him.  
\_\_\_\_\_, they will be angry with him.
4. If they don't hurry, they won't catch the train.  
\_\_\_\_\_, they won't catch the train.
5. If it weren't so late, we would play a game of chess.  
\_\_\_\_\_, we would play a game of chess.
6. If Jeff didn't like Jessica, he wouldn't buy her ice cream.  
\_\_\_\_\_, he wouldn't buy her ice cream.
7. If she didn't bully her classmates, she would have more friends.  
\_\_\_\_\_, she would have more friends.
8. We would have gone to the cinema yesterday if it hadn't rained heavily.  
We would have gone to the cinema yesterday \_\_\_\_\_  
heavily.
