

## Indirect Object Pronouns

Indirect object pronouns (IOP) replace nouns that act as indirect objects. Indirect objects tell us \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_ the action is being done.

IOPs are almost the same as direct object pronouns – except the \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ forms are different.

#### **Uses**

Ex. Carla le da el lápiz a su amigo. --> Carla gives the pencil to her friend.  
(**accompanies**)

Roberto les da unas plumas. --> Roberto gives them some pens.  
(**replaces**)
