COMPARATIVES

Short Adjectives

We add **-er** to the end of short adjectives to make comparative.

Short adjectives ...	Spelling rules	Examples
Usually	+ er	slow → slower fast → faster tall → taller
Ending in -e	+ r	large → larger nice → nicer
Some two-syllable adjectives, especially ending in -y	-y → -i + er	hungry → hungrier happy → happier funny → funnier
Ending in a vowel + a consonant	double the consonant + er	big → bigger fat → fatter fit → fitter

Example:

Bart is **taller than** Maggie.



Long Adjectives

We add **more** in front of long adjectives to make comparative.

more + adj. (2 or more syllables) + than

Example:

beautiful → **more beautiful than**
Maggie is **more beautiful than** Mr. Burns.

*to talk about events happening **NOW**




I **am studying** English




