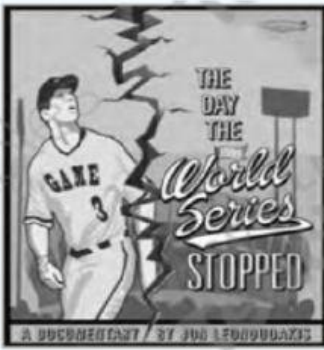


Earthquake!
