<u>Let's learn and understand the following spelling rules:</u>

To spell the verb (with -s or -es) with he/she/it	
With most verbs we just add -s.	drink -drinks ; read-reads; talk-talks
With verbs that end with -o; -ch, -sh, -ss, -x : we add -es	go -goes, teach - teaches, wash - washes, pass - passes, mix- mixes
With verbs that end in consonant +y, we drop the -y and add -ies	fly-flies , dry - dries, try - tries
With verbs that end in vowel +y, we just add -y	play – plays, enjoy – enjoys
The verb have changes to has	have - has
