Cool Cleaner

Curtis Kelly, aged 20, has always enjoyed housework. Even by the age of eight, he had earned the nickname 'Clean Curtis'. His mum always encouraged Curtis and his siblings to do their own household chores, by showing them what to do and rewarding them when they did a good job. For his third birthday, Curtis was given a toy cleaning trolley, which became his favourite toy. His behaviour changed instantly. That day he began by dusting the furniture and soon after moved on to washing up. Other boys his age were watching cartoons or playing football and, although Curtis enjoyed these activities, there was nothing he liked better than sweeping floors.

In December 2018, however, Curtis suffered a serious back injury. He had been putting up some lights, when he missed a step on the ladder. After the fall, he was not allowed to drive for a month and was advised to stay in bed. During recovery he was so bored that he decided to spend his time posting videos and pictures on Instagram.

He initially shared simple ideas about how to clean the bath, toilet, fridge and cooker, and within three weeks he had 2,000 followers. He decided he should show his face, as fans kept asking to see him. They could not believe that the advice came from such a young person. They thought that the internet sensation was not only much older, but they had assumed that it was a woman.

Curtis' job involves looking after elderly people in a care home. He begins work at 4 o'clock in the afternoon and so has time in the day to complete his own cleaning before going to work. He enjoys chatting to the care-home residents about his hobby but admits he often just wants to spend his time there dusting and polishing. In his free time, he continues making videos. He now has 19,700 followers.
