Family

Bear Grylls was born on 7th June 1974 in Northern Ireland, in the UK. His parents, Michael and Sarah, called him Edward. His sister gave him the nickname 'Bear' when he was a baby.

Childhood

When Bear was young, he and his family moved to the Isle of Wight, a small island near the south coast of England. His father taught him to climb the sea cliffs and to sail boats. He became a Scout when he was eight years old.

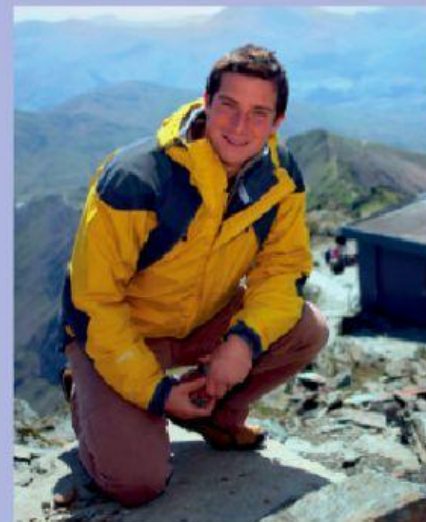
Career

Bear climbed Mount Everest when he was 23 years old. He was one of the youngest people to reach the top. In 2003, Bear crossed the North Atlantic Arctic Ocean in a small boat with only three other people. He ate a meal at 7.6 kilometres above the ground! He had adventures in the Himalayas, Venezuela and Antarctica, too.

Documentary-makers film many of Bear's adventures for TV. There were seven series of one programme, Man vs. Wild, and 1.2 billion people watched it all around the world!
