

Relative Adverbs



- An **adverb** tells more about the verb. It tells **how**, **where**, **when**, or **why** an action takes place.

for example: The little pup ran **quickly** towards his owner.

- A **relative adverb** introduces a group of words, or a clause, that tells more about a noun. There are three main relative adverbs: **where**, **why**, and **when**.

for example: This is the park **where** I come and play every evening.
