KUALA LUMPUR: The worrying level of air pollutants is affecting the health of many city dwellers. Too much pollution in the air can result in eye irritation, coughing and breathing problems.

A major source of air pollution is emissions from vehicles. We must therefore stop depending on fossil fuels and switch to electric vehicles. However, it will not be easy to convince people to change their attitudes.

In an effort to educate the public about the benefits of electric vehicles, the government is starting small. Electric bicycles are being handed out to selected universities in Malaysia to encourage green technology. It is hoped that the public will come to accept that electric transport is a viable alternative to diesel and petrol vehicles. The government aims to have 125,000 charging stations in the country by 2030.
