B. (Present Perfect Tense)

2. The girls had ironed the clothes.

C. (Past Perfect Tense)

1. She has made a call.
2. She had made a call.

D. (Future Perfect Tense)

1. I will have gone there.
2. I will go there.

E. (Present Perfect Tense)

1. Soma had broken another glass.
2. Soma has broken another glass.

F. (Past Perfect Tense)

1. She invited me.
2. She had invited me.

G. (Future Perfect Tense)

1. The teacher will teach the chapter.
2. The teacher will have taught the chapter.

H. (Present Perfect Tense)

1. My son has asked for my mobile phone.
2. My son had asked for my mobile phone.

I. (Future Perfect Tense)

1. The sun will rise soon.
2. The sun will have risen.

J.(Present Perfect Tense)

1. The children have spoken to the parents.
2. The children will have spoken to the parents.

K.(Past Perfect Tense)

1. He had driven.
2. He had been driving.

L.(Future Perfect Tense)

1. We will have stood first.
2. We will have stand first.

M.(Present Perfect Tense)

1. Many people die because of COVID19.
2. Many people have died because of COVID19.

N.(Past Perfect Tense)

1. My mother was sweeping the floor.
2. My mother had swept the floor .

O.(Future Perfect Tense)

1. We will have attended the session.
2. We will attend the session.

P.(Past Perfect Tense)

1. He had eaten a delicious meal.
2. He had been eating a delicious meal.

Q.(Future Perfect Tense)

1. They will have spoken to him.
2. We will speak to him.

R.(Present Perfect Tense)

1. Mr. Robert has decided to bring the meeting to an end.
2. Mr. Robert decides to bring the meeting to an end.

S.(Past Perfect Tense)

- 1.He had watched the animals grazing.
2. He had been watching the animals grazing .

T.(Future Perfect Tense)

1. The ball will hit him.
2. The ball will have hit him.
