5 **II** Tony Inglis was the owner of an engineering company in London. He got the job to remove the red phone boxes from the streets in the 1990s because they were no longer needed. But he believed that people still wanted them. So, he bought hundreds of them. He fixed these phone boxes and started to sell them.

10 **III** At first, that seemed like a crazy idea. "These phone boxes are not like anything we use today," Mr. Inglis says. "They are so old-fashioned, big and heavy. But, on the other hand, we love things that are old, because they help us remember our past. That is why I knew my idea would succeed."

15 **IV** In the end, he was right. Now you can see these red boxes again all over central London. They began coming back because people found new uses for them. Today, they look the same on the outside, but inside they are different. Many of these boxes have an internet connection and a screen. On the screens you can find helpful information like city maps and advertisements for restaurants and shops. And, of course, they also have phones. Some have small libraries and others have coffee machines. The new uses of these phone boxes are just as important for the public as their original use.

20 **V** But some people in London are not so happy to see the red phone boxes again. One of them, John Walker, says, "These boxes are ugly. We really prefer to have green trees instead of the terrible boxes."
