Brief Explanation

We normally use **WILL** to speak about the future. It is always combined with another verb.

We use **WILL** for **Rapid Decisions, Prediction, to make an offer, a promise or a threat.**

1. It does not change in the third person (i.e. he, she, it)
2. It is always combined with another verb in the base form (i.e. without 'to')
3. We don't use it with 'Do' in questions or negatives.

Application

"Will" and the negative form "will not" or "won't" is a modal auxiliary verb.

This means that there is no **s** on the third person singular, and that it is followed by the infinitive:

- 1-He (**will be – will to be – will been**) famous one day.
- 2-(**it will – will it – will**) be sunny tomorrow?
- 3- I think she (**to – will – will be**) pass the exam.

Evaluation

- 1- I (**goes – will go – went**) to the cinema tonight. **CHOOSE**
- 2- I think you (**find – will find – finds**) the movie interesting. **CHOOSE**
- 3- Don't worry, I (**will tell – won't tell – tell**) anyone. **CHOOSE**
