A. Other - more or different , additional	Other students know it better than me. I have no other friend than you. Some books are good; other books are bad
B. The other (s) – the rest, the remaining	Second graders are ready, the others are not. The other apples are yours. Where are the other children?
C. Others - more, apart from those already mentioned	Some of these microphones are better than others . I do not like these shoes. Show me some others . I must consult the others .
D. Another a) one more, an additional (time, distance, money) b) a different one	I would like another glass of wine. He left the room without another word That is another matter. If you are busy, I can come another time
E. All - the whole, everybody (singular and plural nouns)	All the students understood the problem. All horses are animals. All my money was gone. She studied hard all day
F. Every (only with singular nouns)/ refers to 3 or more	Every member was present. I eat 3 apples every day . He was given every opportunity
G. Each (usually used with of / singular countable nouns)refers to 2 or more	I spoke to each student separately. Each of his painting is beautiful. The building has an exit at each side
H. Both / the two ; one and the other/ (plural nouns)	Both girls are ill. Read both these books!
I. Either /one or the other of two ; one and the other of two/(singular countable nouns)	You can take either sweater . I do not mind which. You can go by either road . There are houses at either side of the street
J. Neither - negative form of either (no one of two)	Neither solution is good. Neither of the boys saw the accident.
K. None (of) – not any from many	None of the boys came back. Any news today? None
