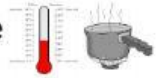


Conditionals

Type 0: If/When + Present Simple → Present Simple

When you **heat** ice, it **melts**. *General truths/Laws of Nature



Type 1: If + Present Simple → Future Simple/Imperative/Modals+bare infinitive

If you **study**, you **will pass**. *Sth likely to happen in the future



Type 2: If + Past Simple → would + bare infinitive

If I **were** rich, I **would buy** a Ferrari. *Unreal Present

If I **were** you, I'd talk to him. * To Give Advice



Type 3: If + Past Perfect → would have + past participle

If you **hadn't slept**, you **wouldn't have missed** the bus. *Unreal Past
