

Describing the Weather in the Past and Future

You can describe the weather conditions in the past or the future. You just need to change the verb "to be" to its past or future form and specify a time frame.

1. We still use the pronoun "**It**" to describe the weather.
2. "**It**" is followed by a form of the verb "**to be**."
 - a. For the **past** (it has already happened), the form of "**to be**" is "**was**."
 - b. For the **future** (it hasn't happened yet), the form of "**to be**" is "**will be**."
3. Then use the weather vocabulary words we have been using this lesson.
4. You also need to specify the time frame (like yesterday or tomorrow).
 - a. It can be placed at the beginning or at the end of the sentence.

Remember: Every sentence begins with a capital letter and ends with a period.

Example:

(Yesterday)



It was cold yesterday.

or

Yesterday, it was cold.

(Tomorrow)

It will be cold tomorrow.
