is used to indicate that the action took place before the indicated time:

When Diego arrives home, he first puts his backpack in his bedroom and washes his hands **before eating.**

is used with the prepositions "to" or "till/until", interchangeably, to indicate the beginning and the end of an action:

My family and I lived in Monterrey **from 2000 to 2012.**

is used to indicate the duration of an action:
My sister has been swimming **for 3 years.**

is used to indicate that the action takes place after the indicated time:

finishing the competition I felt extremely happy with my score.
