Comparative and superlative adjectives

REMEMBER!:

- **COMPARATIVE:** Compare 2 nouns. We add **-er** to the adjectives with **one** syllable and **more** to the adjective with **more than one** syllable. Example:
 - (tall, One syllable adjective) The giraffe is **taller** than the mouse.
 - (important, more than one syllable adjective) Studying is **more important** than playing around.
- **SUPERLATIVE:** Compare more than 2 nouns. We add **-est** to the adjectives with **one** syllable, and **the most** to the adjectives with **more than one** syllable. Example:
 - (big, one syllable adjective) The elephant is the **biggest** animal on earth.
 - (captivating, more than one syllable adjective) Among all the books I've read, 'To Kill a Mockingbird' is **the most captivating**.
