Teen Magazines

- A. Youth World is an entertainment magazine full of ideas on what to do. It provides details of all the latest films, concerts, exhibitions and fashion shows. If you are someone who prefers to stay in, it also recommends the best DVDs to watch.
- B. Teens Now is a successful music magazine for teenagers that lists who is playing, where and when and how to get tickets. Interviews with well-known singers and groups as well as detailed biographies are included. It also gives its readers the chance to send in their own articles.
- C. NS Teens magazine is well-known for its wildlife and environmental content but it also has articles on the history and culture of people from around the world. Some of the articles are long and detailed but the magazine is also famous for its fantastic photo-journalism. There are also letters from readers as well as maps and fact sheets.
- D. Some leading journalists write for Teen People, a music magazine aimed at the teen market. There are interviews with new bands as well as the latest news on recordings, tours and festivals. A popular feature is the annual reader's vote for the best new band.
- E. Top Teens is easy to read and full of colour photographs. There is a range of different sections including those offering fashion and beauty advice. But the majority of its pages are devoted to interviews with the popular, well-known stars of cinema, music and sport.
- F. The only environmental magazine written by teenagers for teenagers is Young WB. Readers are invited to send their articles and photographs to the magazine's offices and material is chosen for the next issue. As well as articles about the natural world, the magazine also has many special offers and competitions.
- G. Teen Plus is very different from the average teen magazine that simply offers articles on pop stars and fashion. This exciting new magazine informs readers about what is happening in the world through its in-depth articles on current affairs, politics and science. It also offers a variety of reviews on recent books, films and music CDs.
- H. No journalists write for Teen Voice. This magazine depends completely on articles sent in by teenage readers. It gives young people the opportunity to publish their creative work, such as poems or short works of fiction or to voice their opinions on important issues. They can also write reviews of the latest music CDs.

MUSIC WEBSITES

- A. GET MUSIC** this is a popular music site that sells the latest CDs across a variety of musical styles, from rock to classical, so you need to know what you're looking for. It is possible to listen to selected songs before ordering and the site also reviews CDs that are about to go on sale. Prices are relatively low and delivery is free but takes five days.
- C. AUDIOWORLD** The site sells all the latest CDs and music videos online and is good for information about events in the music world. There are detailed lists of concerts and festivals happening throughout Europe as well as links to sites selling tickets. Delivery within 48 hours available on all items for an extra charge.
- E. AMOEBA MUSIC** This is the website for an international company and some CD imports that are extremely hard to find are available here. It is possible to hear selected tracks from CDs before you buy and information about a wide range of musicians is also available. There are delivery charges on all items ordered from the site.
- G. CD UNIVERSE** You can stop online here for all the latest CDs and music videos. It is an attractive, well-presented site that is also user-friendly. A range of customer reviews are available so you can check another customer's opinion of a CD you are interested in. These are a CD you are interested in. These are updated regularly and are well worth a look.
- B. METEOR CITY** This site sells hard-to-find CDs from the 1980s and 1990s and includes an A-Z list of top selling bands from that period as well as detailed biographies of band members. There are also reviews of these CDs online. Delivery is included in the cost of the CD.
- D. MUSIC ZONE** This well-presented site specialises in jazz from the 50s and 60s and is popular with many collectors. You can also buy and sell instruments and sheet music on this site. Delivery within 48 hours is available on many items.
- F. CD SOUND** This claims to be one of the largest online music stores and has over 15000 CDs to choose from. You can also listen to video interviews with music industry stars on this site or buy concert tickets, the CDs are slightly more expensive than elsewhere and although delivery is free it takes five days.
- H. NETSOUNDS** This online store offers a low-price guarantee on its huge selection of music, including all the latest CDs. The site is easy to use and all CDs are listed both by title and name of band. Detailed biographies of a wide range of musicians are also available on the site.

| <p>A. This course provides students with a broad understanding of the history of art from ancient times to the present day. Students may choose Italian Renaissance painters or 19th-century French Impressionists as an area of individual study. The course is on Fridays from 1- 4.30 pm and includes talks by professional artists and visits to museums.</p> | <p>B. This course helps you understand the work of some greatest writers in the world today. You are encouraged to think about the writer's main messages and are given help with understanding difficult texts. There is also the opportunity to choose writers that interest you for further study. Classes are on Tuesdays and Friday from 7.30-9.30 p.m.</p> |
| <p>C. On this course you study the history of art from the earliest cave paintings to modern-day sculpture and you learn to understand art as a product of the time in which it was made. The course is on Thursday and Friday evenings and some classes include visits to local museums.</p> | <p>D. No experience is necessary on this basic painting and drawing course, which includes both demonstrations and practical advice. Students have the opportunity to draw animals, flowers and people in a relaxed and enjoyable atmosphere and are shown various ways of using watercolours and oil paints. Classes are from 7.30-9.30pm on Fridays.</p> |
| <p>E. With the help of an experienced author, you learn how to create characters and use descriptive language in your work. You are encouraged to develop a personal style and you gain practice in specific areas such as the short story. Classes are on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1-3pm.</p> | <p>F. What can we learn from the writing of the past? This course explores the work of 16th-century English writers such as Shakespeare, and is aimed at students who wish to study the literature of the period in depth. Classes are from 6.30-9.30pm, Monday to Friday, and include some theatre trips.</p> |
| <p>G. This course is for experienced artists who would like to develop their skills and experiment in a range of creative areas including drawing, sculpture and printing. Classes are on Tuesdays and Fridays from 2-5pm and take place in the college's art studio. There are also organised trips to art galleries to see the work of well-known artists.</p> | <p>H. This advanced course is suitable for anyone hoping to make progress with their painting. It includes trips to local gardens and forests where students have the opportunity to work outdoors. It is led by an experienced artist, who provides help in different techniques. Classes are from 1-5pm Mondays and Wednesdays.</p> |
