Surprisingly, Vanderbilt was happy with the new dish. The new dish later became known as potato chips.

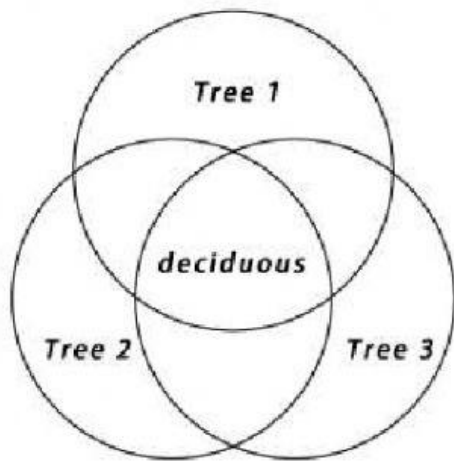
