- a) _____: refers to an exceptionally abundant yield of crops or agricultural produce during a particular growing season. It typically exceeds the average or expected yield, resulting in a surplus of crops.
- b) _____: is a severe shortage of food in a particular region or country, resulting in widespread hunger, malnutrition, and sometimes starvation. It occurs when there is an extreme scarcity of food due to various factors such as crop failure, natural disasters, political instability, or economic issues.
- c) _____: is a practice in agriculture where different crops are grown sequentially in the same field over a period of time. It involves changing the type of crops planted in a specific area from season to season or year to year. This technique helps maintain soil fertility, control pests and diseases, and improve overall crop yield.
- d) _____: refers to a successful and satisfactory yield of crops or agricultural produce. It implies that the amount and quality of the harvested crops meet or exceed expectations, resulting in sufficient supply for consumption, sale, or storage.
- e) _____: refers to a disappointing or poor yield of crops or agricultural produce. It indicates that the amount and quality of the harvested crops fall below expectations, leading to potential shortages, financial losses, or reduced availability of food or other agricultural products.
