

# LET'S EXPRESS OUR SPECIFIC PREFERENCES

## with Would Rather and Would Prefer

\* **Would rather** is followed by the **infinitive without to**. **Would prefer** is followed by **to + infinitive** or a noun:

- I'd rather have fruit juice. / I'd rather not have any juice.
- I'd prefer to have fruit juice. / I'd prefer not to have any juice.
- I'd prefer fruit juice. (noun, no verb)



\* We say **would rather** bla bla bla **than** bla bla bla.

We say **would prefer** bla bla bla **rather than** bla bla or **would prefer** bla bla **instead of** bla bla :

- It's such nice weather - I'd rather sit in the garden than watch TV.
- It's such nice weather - I'd prefer to sit in the garden rather than watch TV.
- It's such nice weather - I'd prefer to sit in the garden instead of watching TV.

• rather than and instead of = ao invés de/em vez de
