1 Internet

People from Canada spend, on average, 43.5 hours per week online, 8 hours longer than people in the U.S., who come in second. One reason: Canada has long, cold winters, so people spend lots of time indoors.

2 Sports

Soccer is king. In second place, surprisingly, is cricket. Only a few nations play the game seriously, but it's very popular in India, which has 1.2 billion people.

3 Outdoors

New Zealanders spend the most time outdoors. The countryside is perfect for hiking, mountain climbing and water sports. If you live in New Zealand, you're never more than two hours' drive from the ocean. And then there is the rugby, too ...

The U.K. has six of the top 20 most visited art galleries/museums in the world, including the National Gallery, the British Museum and Tate Modern.




7 Party!
