















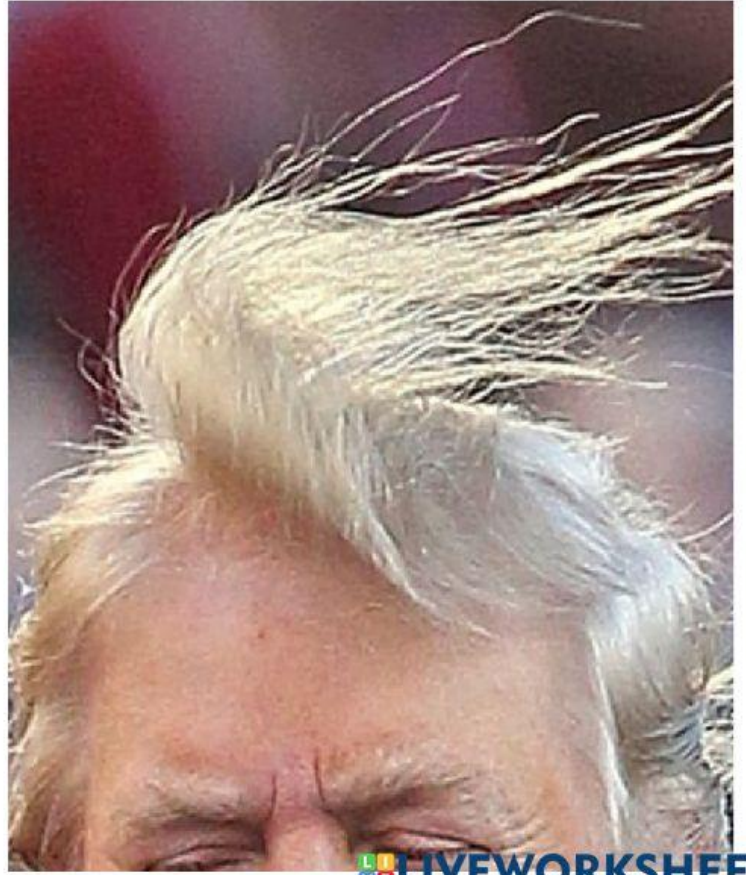
FORMING POSSESSIVE NOUNS

	• My mom's bag 		

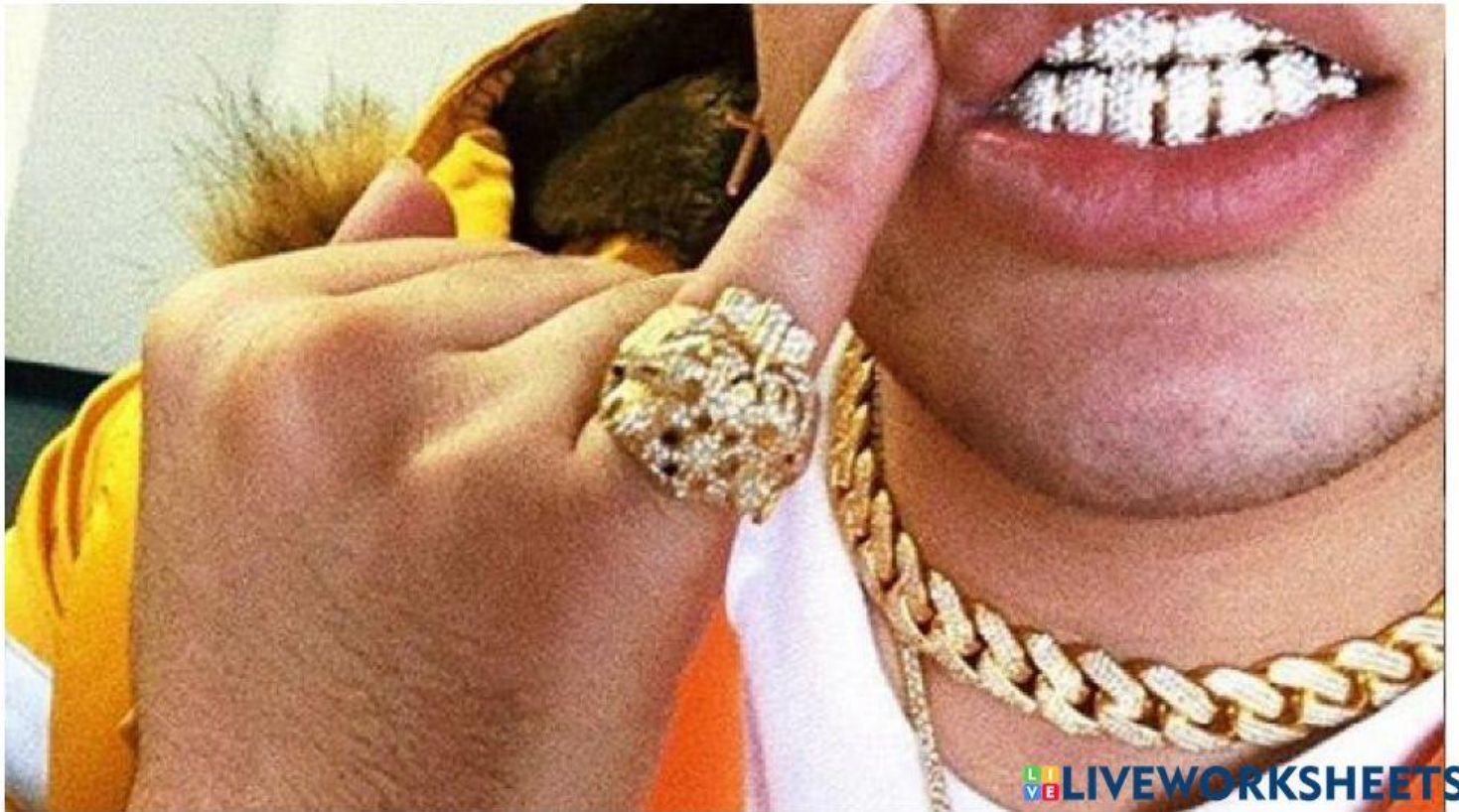
