



## Have and have got

Have got	Have
(+) They've got a brother. (?) Have they got a brother? - Yes, they <b>have</b> . - No, they <b>haven't</b> .	They <b>have</b> a brother. Do they <b>have</b> a brother? - Yes, they <b>do</b> . - No, they <b>don't</b> .
(-) They <b>haven't got</b> any brothers.	They <b>don't have</b> any brothers.
(+) She's got long blonde hair. (?) Has she got long blonde hair? - Yes, she <b>has</b> . - No, she <b>hasn't</b> .	She <b>has</b> long blonde hair. Does she <b>have</b> long blonde hair? - Yes, she <b>does</b> . - No, she <b>doesn't</b> .
(-) She <b>hasn't got</b> long blonde hair.	She <b>doesn't have</b> long blonde hair.
