- \_\_\_\_\_ : a sport such as judo or karate, in which you fight with your hands and feet (ศิลปะการต่อสู้ป้องกันตัว)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : a Japanese fighting sport, in which you use your hands and feet to hit and kick



(カラテ : ศิลปะการต่อสู้ป้องกันตัวของประเทศญี่ปุ่น)

- \_\_\_\_\_ : something that you use for playing music, such as a piano or guitar (เครื่องดนตรี)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : saxophone; a curved musical instrument made of metal that you play by blowing into it and pressing buttons, used especially popular music and jazz (แซกโซโฟน)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : to spend
- a lot of time in a particular place or with particular people (เกี่ยวติดต่อกัน)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : to move over snow on skis (flat pieces of wood) (เล่นสกี)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : sport played inside, like basketball and hockey (กีฬาในร่ม)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : taking a long walk, often in the country (การเดินเขา, เดินดอย, การเดินเที่ยวระยะไกล)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : to move over ice wearing special boots with metal blades (เล่นสเก็ต)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : a person that you make friends with by sending emails, often somebody you have never met (เพื่อนทางอินเทอร์เน็ต)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : a Japanese sport or method of defense in which you try to throw your opponent onto the ground (กีฬายูโด)
- \_\_\_\_\_ : a piece of work that student is asked to do (งาน, ภาระบ้าน)
