1. SUCH -

1. Used to add **emphasis**.
2. It is followed by an **ADJECTIVE + NOUN**
Normal: It was a long day
Emphasis: It was **such a** long day!
- a. Singular nouns: **SUCH A**
He's **such an** intelligent boy!
She has **such a** pretty face
It was **such an** enormous house
- b. Plural and uncountable nouns: **SUCH**
We had **such** nice weather!
She wore **such** trendy boots!

SO -

1. Used to add **emphasis**.
2. It is followed by an **ADJECTIVE**
Normal: It was a long day
Emphasis: The day was **so** long!

Examples:
He is so intelligent!
Her face is so pretty
The house was !
The weather was
Her boots were

2. Complete with such or such a



I was sleeping when I heard loud noise!
You're good friend
They're good artists
My neighbours are rude people that no-one likes them
Avatar is great film that I want to see it again

3. ENOUGH -


- Example: I have enough money
1. Followed by a **NOUN**
I haven't got **enough** time
She never has **enough** money
 2. After an **ADJECTIVE**
You aren't **old enough**
We weren't fast **enough**

TOO -

- Example: It is too cold
1. It is followed by an **ADJECTIVE**
You are **too young**
He is **too slow**
